

Ordained in 1976, Bishop Jonathan's ministry has been as far afield as Oxfordshire, Barbados, Wiltshire, Kent and Devon. After being Dean of Exeter Cathedral, he was consecrated Bishop of Lynn in 2011, the suffragan see in the diocese of Norwich.

On Sunday 14 May the Chaplain will be away preaching at Canterbury Cathedral at a service for The King's School, Canterbury.

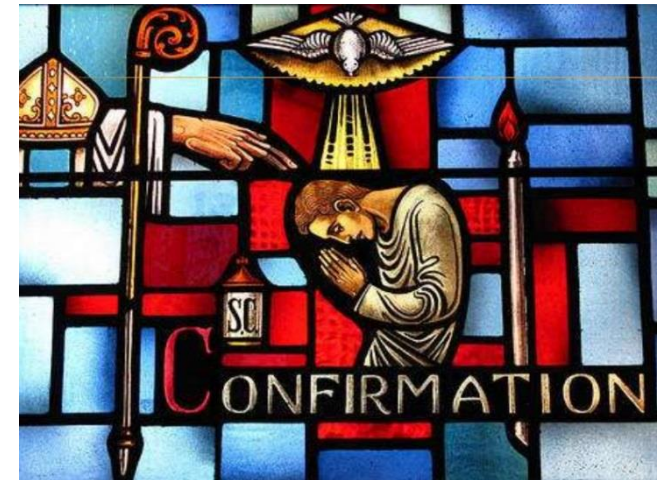

On Wednesday 17 May, the chapel fulfils its role as the chapel of the Royal Victorian Order. Many of the visitors to the Chapel during the week are curious about the Order.

The order was instituted by Queen Victoria in 1896 as a means of recognising service to Royal Family. It has five grades: knights or dames grand cross (GCVO), knights or dames commander (KCVO/DCVO), commanders (CVO), lieutenants (LVO) and members (MVO). The armorial plates of the knights and dames grand cross can be seen on the oak panels on the chapel walls.

Our congratulations go to those who have been recently appointed to the order by command of HM The Queen. We welcome them to their chapel.



On Sunday 21 May the Sung Eucharist will incorporate the sacraments of baptism and confirmation. It will be a pleasure to welcome The Right Reverend Jonathan Meyrick, Bishop of Lynn, as the presiding bishop on this occasion.
