Mothering Sunday

This day is traditionally kept on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, which this year falls on 11 March. Because there is traditionally a relaxation of Lenten vows on this particular Sunday in celebration of the fellowship of family and church, the name Refreshment Sunday is sometimes used. Rose Sunday is another alternative title for the day, shown by purple vestments being replaced in some churches by rose-coloured ones. The traditional distribution of flowers will follow the 11am service that morning.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on 25 March, commemorating Christ's entry into Jerusalem.
