Sunday 11 November

This year marks the centenary of Armistice Day 1918: 'the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month'. Although the armistice ended the fighting, it needed to be prolonged three times until the Treaty of Versailles, which was signed on 28 June, took effect on 10 January 1920. By 11 November 1918, 16 million people had died in the conflict.



At 6am the flag of Duchy of Lancaster will be raised over the Chapel and a piper will play 'Battle's Over'. The morning service will begin at 10.55am to allow for a period of silence before we stand for the formal 2 minutes silence at 11am. At 7pm as the day draws to a close and

the flag is lowered a bugler will play the 'Last Post'.

Sunday 9 December

The 11am service this Sunday will be a special one to mark the centenary of the union of Greater Romania, one of the consequences of the First World War. The break-up of the Austro-Hungarian Empire after the war led to the incorporation of the Romanian-speaking provinces of that empire into Romania. It will also mark the first anniversary of the passing of His Majesty King Michael of Romania, who died on 5 December 2017. Those of us who were present in the chapel on 8 November 2012 will never forget the service held that day in the presence of His Majesty, to celebrate the beginning of his seventy-fifth year as a knight grand cross of the Royal Victorian Order. The service will also commemorate the life of Queen Marie of Romania (1875-1938) in the 80th year of her passing. Queen Marie was King Michael's grandmother, and a granddaughter of Queen Victoria. A statue of her is to be unveiled this year at her birthplace, Eastwell Park, Kent.

Please let the Steward know if you wish to attend. There will be an allocation of tickets for the members of the Romanian community, and it is anticipated that there will be a large congregation on this day. It is possible that admission will have to be by ticket only. The names of the principal guests will be announced nearer to the date.
