Remembrance Sunday

falls this year on Sunday 11 November. The Chapel is playing its part in 'Battle's Over', an international commemoration marking 100 years since the guns fell silent at the end of World War I. At 6am 'Battle's O'er', a traditional Scottish air played after a battle, will be played outside the Chapel, and a specially written tribute will be read aloud. At the same time, over 1,000 pipers will be playing the tune in individual locations throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, and at scores of locations overseas, including New Zealand, Ireland, Australia, Bermuda, France, Belgium, Canada, the United States and Germany. The morning service will begin at 10.55am to allow for a period of silent reflection before we stand for the formal two minutes silence at 11am. The collection will be given to the Royal British Legion. At 6.55pm buglers will sound the Last Post at more than 1,000 locations, where at 7pm beacons will be lit in a tribute called Beacons of Light, signifying the light of peace that emerged from the darkness of four years of war.
