*Charitable Giving*

The back page of this monthly programme gives a list of the charitable donations made from the chapel collections. Because the structure and fabric of the chapel are maintained by the Duchy of Lancaster, we do not face the difficulties of many of parish churches, where the heavy burden of caring a sometimes large, historic and beautiful building falls mostly on the limited resources of sometimes small congregations. The policy agreed by the chapel council is to give away 50% of our collections to charitable causes. As you will see from the list, our donations have gone towards charities especially connected with the relief of poverty, sickness and homelessness. If any member of the congregation would like to suggest a deserving charity, then please let the Steward know.

The remaining 50% of the collections are used for routine chapel operations, such as communion wafers and wine, candle oil and funding social events such as the weekly refreshments, annual hog roast and barbecue lunches on Choristers' Parents Sunday and the Patronal Festival. It is also used for minor improvements to the appearance of the chapel, such as the recovering of the seat cushions and kneelers.
