The penitential season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 6 March. There will be a service of Holy Communion at 12.30pm that day.

The season commemorates the time spent by Christ in the wilderness. The

accompanying picture, entitled 'Christ in the Desert' was painted in 1872 by the Russian artist Ivan Kramskoi (1837-87). As one observer noted: 'The entire figure seems to have diminished a bit from its natural size, contracted, not from starvation, thirst and bad weather, but from internal, inhuman insight to his thought and will during the struggle of forces of spirit and flesh.' It conveys something of the endurance of Christ in those 'forty days and forty nights.'
