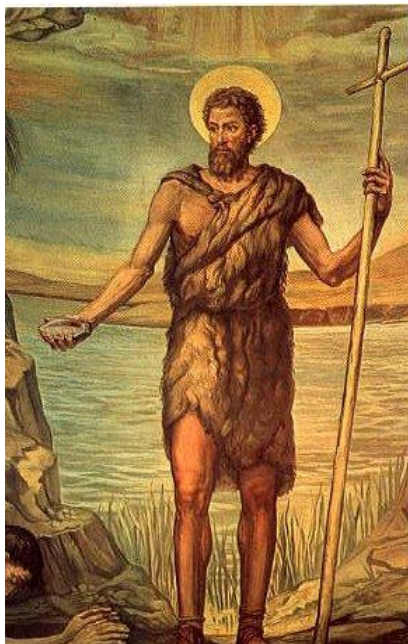

Sunday 2 June

On this Sunday, the Sung Eucharist will include the sacrament of confirmation. It will be a pleasure to welcome The Right Reverend Peter Wheatley as the presiding bishop on this occasion. Now retired, Bishop Peter served as archdeacon of Hampstead 1985-99 and bishop of Edmonton 1999-2015.

Confirmation is a step in the Christian journey at which a person affirms for himself or herself the faith into which they were baptized and their intention to live a life of committed discipleship. This affirmation is confirmed through prayer and the laying on of hands by the confirming bishop. Please come and support each of them in the decision they have taken.



Sunday 24 June

On this Sunday the Chapel celebrates its patronal festival by keeping the feast of the Birth of Saint John the Baptist. The chapel is all that remains of a hospital founded by the will of King Henry VII, to be called the 'Hospital of Henry late King of England of the Savoy.' The hospital was dedicated in the name of Saint John the Baptist, the great forerunner of Christ. His message was delivered in the powerful oratory of an Old Testament prophet, and he represents a bridge between the Old and New Testaments.
